



## I N T R O D U C T O R Y.

For the third of these Special Bibliographies, I have compiled a list, supposed to be complete to the end of July 1879, of the writings of Mr. Samuel H. Scudder, of Cambridge, Mass. ## Scudder, Samuel Hubbard.

Born in Boston 13 April 1837. Graduated at Williams College in 1857, and at the Lawrence Scientific School of Harvard University in 1862. Mr. Scudder has, since that time, taken prominent part in the business of the Boston Society of Natural History, in which he has held the following offices: Recording Secretary, 1862-1870; Librarian, 1864-1870; Custodian, 1864-1865 and 1866-1870; and Vice President from 1874 to the present time [1879]. He has been Librarian of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences since 1877. Mr. Scudder resides in Cambridge, Mass.




