## KALE OR BORECOLE

CULTURE-1 ounce of either Green Curled or Spring Kale or 2 ounces of Scotch are sufficient for 100 feet of drill. For an acre, $11 / 2$ pounds of either Green Curled or Spring, and from 3 to 7 pounds of the Scotch. Scotch Kale being particularly subject to the attacks of insects, both before and after coming up, it is necessary to sow it very thickly.
