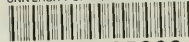

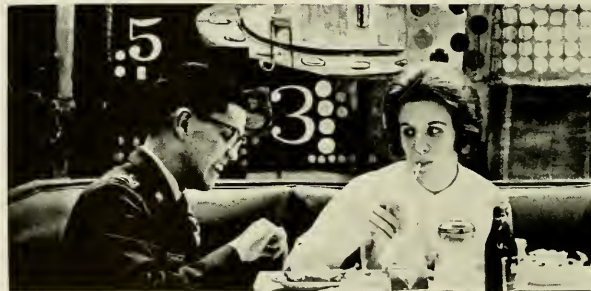

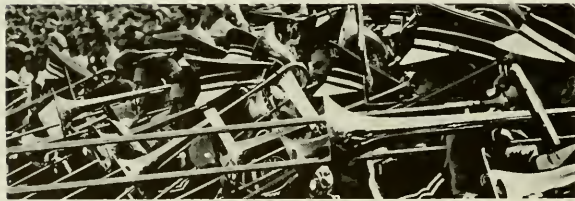

and hitherto unopened door.



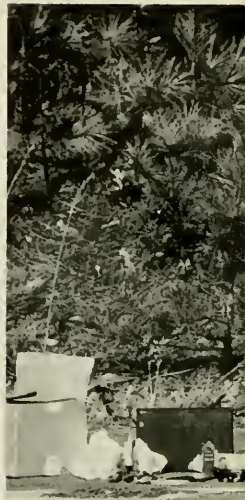


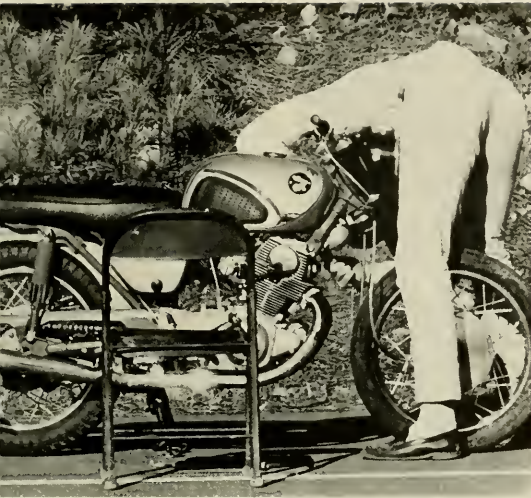

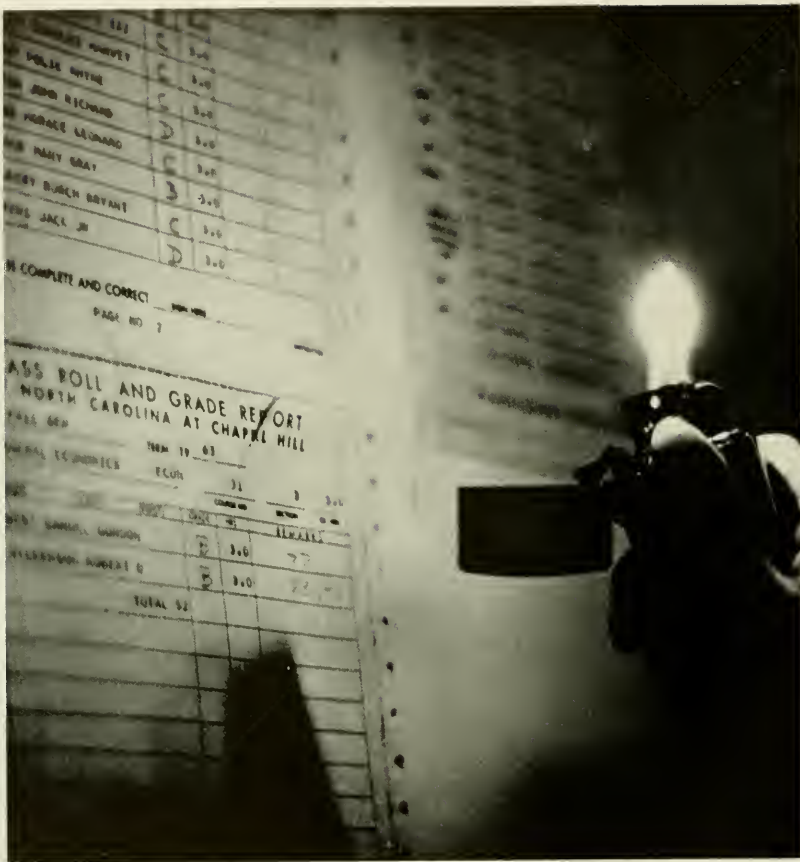

 is made up of these.**



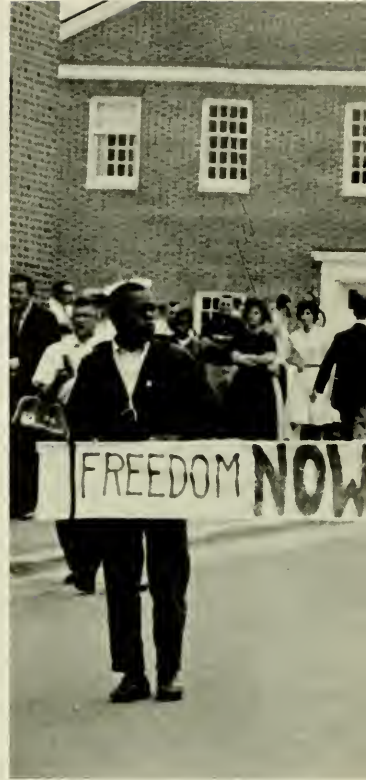

ACADEMICS

The campus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is indeed rich in outstanding professors who are sincerely devoted to the task of instilling within Carolina men and women both an appreciation and an understanding of the Arts and Sciences. Each year the **Yackety Yack** is proud to recognize eight professors whom we consider to be particularly exceptional teachers and helpers.



STEPHEN B. BAXTER, Ph.D., 1955 (Cambridge), Associate Professor of English History, is well known to students through his many popular courses dealing with the Tudor-Stuart period, the Eighteenth Century, the British Empire and Commonwealth, and various other related subjects. Dr. Baxter received a Guggenheim fellowship, 1959-1960, to Holland, Belgium, England, and Ireland. In 1956, he made a research trip to England aided by a grant from the Social Science Research Council. Currently his biography of William III is being printed in addition to his **The Development of the Treasury, 1660-1702**, published in 1957.

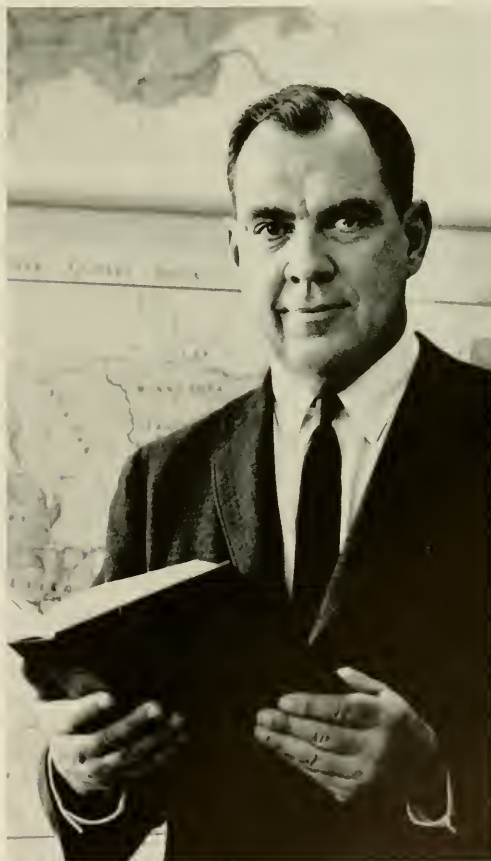
OSBORNE BENNETT HARDISON, JR., Ph.D., 1956 (University of Wisconsin), Professor of English, is noted for his erudite studies in Renaissance Literature as well as Modern Literary Criticism. His numerous publications include an anthology entitled, **Modern Continental Literary Criticism**, **The Enduring Monument**, a study of Renaissance critical theory and its effect on selected poems, and **English Renaissance Criticism**. Dr. Hardison occupies his spare time as a member of the Woodrow Wilson Nominating Committee, as the Vice-Chairman of the Duke-North Carolina Cooperative Program in the Humanities, and as Chairman of the Southeastern Institute of Medieval and Renaissance Studies.





JACQUES HARDRE, Ph.D., 1948 (University of North Carolina and the University of Paris). Professor of French, was born in Dinan (Cotes-du-Nord), France and in 1956 became a naturalized American citizen. Dr. Hardre is listed in such distinguished publications as *Who's Who in Europe*, *Who's Who in France*, the *Directory of American Scholars*, and *North Carolina Lives*. As a member of several professional organizations, and president of the American Association of Teachers of French, Dr. Hardre is recognized as outstanding in many prominent organizations as well as literary circles for his books, articles and monographs. He is, however, particularly noted on the campus of the University of North Carolina for having been the founder of the Alliance Francaise de Chapel Hill.

FRANK W. KLINGBERG, Ph.D., 1948 (University of California at Los Angeles). Professor of American History, is primarily interested in nineteenth and early twentieth century American history with a flare for the Civil War and Reconstruction period. Dr. Klingberg has been awarded several grants, among which are included a grant-in-aid from the Carnegie Corporation, from the Ford Foundation, a research grant from the Social Science Research Council and a grant-in-aid from the University of North Carolina Research Council. Recently he has been offered a Fulbright Grant to teach at the Johns Hopkins Center in Bologna, Italy. His books and numerous articles are widely commended and now in progress is his latest book, *The Mind of the Southern Unionist*. Dr. Klingberg will be listed in the next addition of *Who's Who in America*.





LILLIAN YOUNGS LEHMAN, Ph.D., 1954 (University of North Carolina), Assistant Professor of Zoology, has written several scientific articles in cooperation with her husband, Dr. H. E. Lehman, on the development of pigmentation and cell migrations in amphibians, hybridization and nuclear transplants in amphibians, and protein synthesis in sea urchin eggs. In 1954, Dr. Lehman was awarded a National Science Foundation Postdoctorate Research Fellowship for research at Stanford University. Dr. Lehman's summers are spent at the Bermuda Biological Station where she is engaged in researching the field of developmental biology.

RICHARD IVOR LEVIN, Ph.D., 1959 (University of North Carolina), Associate Professor of Industrial Management, holds degrees in Industrial Engineering as well as Economics and Business Administration. Currently Dr. Levin is engaged in research dealing with management simulation using digital computers, the Markov chain analysis for brand switching cases, and learning behavior in complex management simulations. In addition to his admirable research, Dr. Levin has written his own textbook entitled *An Introduction to Operations Research*. Aside from his publications and popularity as a teacher, Dr. Levin is a successful Management Consultant in and around Chapel Hill.



ROSS E. SCROGGS, B.S., 1942 (University of North Carolina), is an Assistant Professor of RTVMP, and Associate Director of the Communications Center of the University. After five years as a research chemist with Eastman Kodak Company, Mr. Scroggs returned to the University of North Carolina as Director of the Photographic Laboratory. Teaching motion picture production, photography, and electronics for the Physics department, Mr. Scroggs is highly diversified in his talents. His principal interest, however, is photography and he has produced a number of documentary and research motion pictures. Although noted for his many inventions, the most familiar of his accomplishments in photography is that inimitable example of photographic portraiture — the ID card.



ROLLIE TILLMAN, D.B.A., 1962 (Harvard), Associate Professor of Business Administration, is a specialist in marketing and marketing research. He is a former Assistant Editor of the *Harvard Business Review*, and has published articles in various journals and books of readings on marketing. Currently Dr. Tillman is Chairman of the Committee on Teaching of Marketing of the American Marketing Association, and is engaged in research on consumer shopping behavior. When he graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1955, he was awarded the Parker Medal for unique leadership in student government. As adviser in the General College he continues his interest in student life.

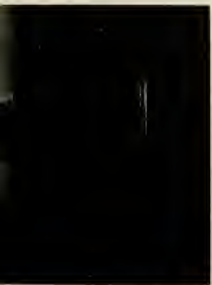

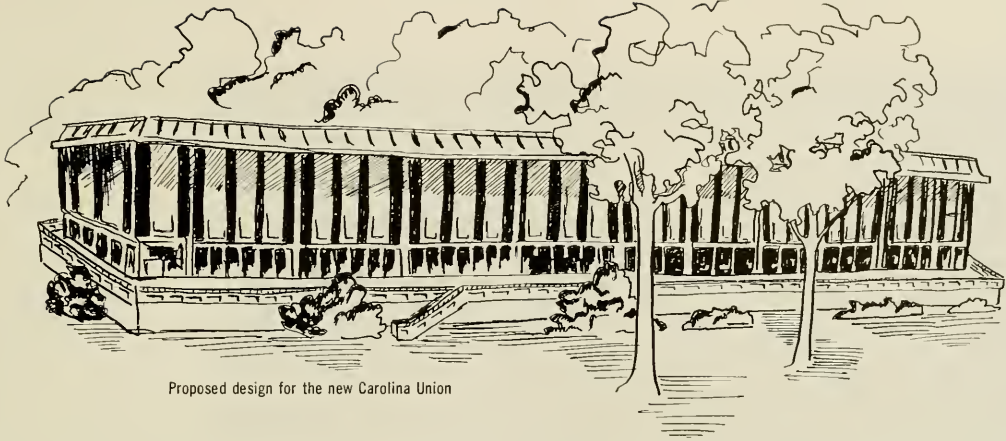

Proposed design for the new Carolina Union

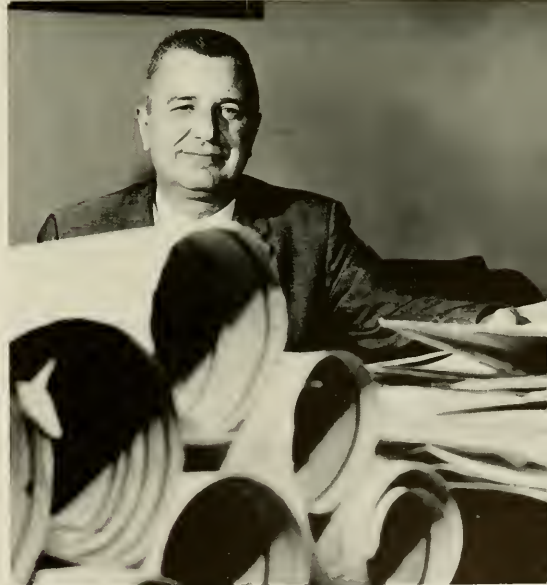
CAROLINA UNION PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

PUBLICATIONS

Publications at Carolina can mean many things to different people: information on an organization, light poetry, old memories, or if one is in the mood, a rambunctious article on how to cure the world's problems by one easy method. These are all incorporated into the four publications: **The Yackety Yack**, **The Carolina Handbook**, **The Carolina Quarterly**, and **The Daily Tar Heel**, all of whose offices are located in Graham Memorial. Works of literary freedom under the control of the Publications Board, they are produced by staffs vigorously going about their work.

The Yack, like all yearbooks, portrays the campus, but it is not like any yearbook; it is the Carolina book, the Carolina Way of Life portrayed between the covers. Recognized and respected nationally as one of the finest in the country, it works year after year to perpetuate the fleeting memories at Carolina.



The Handbook is the guide to new students, the companion and know-it-all for almost any question about the campus; not only does it inform, but it also enlightens. **The Quarterly**, however, is a collection of short stories, poetry, and prose from students here on campus, a literary publication which not only presents student literary works, but delves into the complexities of creative writing.

The Daily Tar Heel, with over seventy years of editorial freedom behind it, has continued to report, as in years past, not only campus and state news, but bulletins from the nation and from the world.



THE CAROLINA QUARTERLY

The *Carolina Quarterly*, the student literary magazine, has continued to publish works of poetry, short stories, prose, etc. by students on campus as well as others on campuses around the country. Published four times annually, the *Quarterly* is on sale at almost every convenient spot in Chapel Hill. Edited this year by Louis Bourne, the *Quarterly* has produced even more stimulating and well-written works as the book promises to do again next year.

THE DAILY TAR HEEL STRIKES AGAIN

Despite efforts of the CENSORED pigs in the advertising department and of irate members of the faculty and student body, the **Daily Tar Heel** managed to continue missing deadlines and infuriating the print shop all year.

In the midst of screams, reams, and pounding typewriters and fists, the **Tar Heel** did improve, despite opposing, prejudiced (sic) views. Less and less wire news was carried and less and less space was provided by the advertising magnates.

Through it all, the paper survived, taking on all comers and generally coming out on top (perhaps because of lack of space available to the opposition).

The assassination of President John Kennedy marked the **Tar Heel's** biggest journalistic challenge, with coverage widely acclaimed and writing highly rewarded, a \$750 Hearst award going to Sports Editor-turned human, Curry Kirkpatrick.

In other light moments, Mickey Blackwell's banana (sic) column, Micksup, was generally condemned by all, especially by the widely known, except by name Sot Bosman. Vituperative Fred Seely dissented.

The greatest loss was Blanchard and Ethridge's mind (they had been sharing it up until the end). Wayne King, dating back to the Garfield administration in his **Tar Heel** service was still sitting in his chair uttering his usual, "Hell, yes, that's as good as anything else. Let's get a beer."

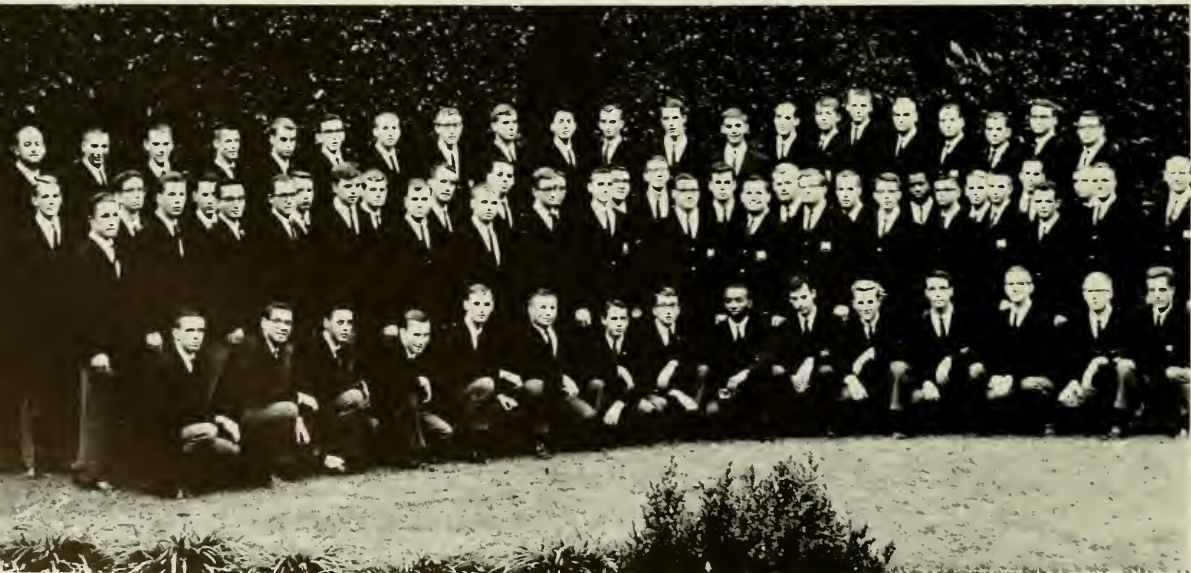

GOVERNMENT FACE UP TO ISSUES

Following their inauguration by Whitney Durand, chairman of the Constitutional Council, the three Student Party officers and the University Party vice-president, plunged into the issue-oriented year promised by President Lawler. All in all, it was a year formed around the involvement of more students than ever before in what goes on in the S.G. offices on the second floor of G.M. Students, faculty and administration immediately became aware of just how highly students regard their tradition of jurisdiction in student discipline and student self-government with the lengthy deliberations on the controversial apartment rule.

Soon, fearing an announced demonstration might seriously harm student-administrative negotiations on the earlier administrative clamp-down on the annual PiKA Beat Dook parade, S.G. managed to re-schedule the demonstration. Lawler led about 1,000 residence hall men to protest three-man rooms and hiking dormitory rents near President Friday's home showing support of the President's negotiations in Raleigh. Lawler, earlier, had accepted

responsibility for the Beat Dook affair, a personal responsibility for student responsibility in the next parade. Coordinator Tommy Harris, PiKA, and the "anti-grossness" committee brought the planning of the parade off without a hitch. Its immediate cancellation because of President Kennedy's assassination also brought praise from the community. Lawler and Harris won another battle for student self-government, student autonomy and student control . . . time-worn phrases this year.

The controversial speaker ban, H.B. No. 1395, penetrated S.G. activities several times throughout the year. C.U.S.C. considered meaty problems for a change and went into a fairly thorough orientation on the unfortunate situation. Lawler followed up an idea sounded out at the N.S.A. Congress this past August and hosted 30 visiting student leaders from other state schools for an orientation meeting on the Bill. S.G. poured out student sentiment via mailings across the State on the gag-law situation.

Judicial clarification in the lower court system, with one item on the orders-of-the-day being a widening of practical and fairer penalties under the Campus Code, was begun. After extensive hearings conducted by S.P. majority floor leader and judicial committee chairman Phil Baddour, the severe penalty of expulsion was defeated by the Student Legislature. Judicial activity was spearheaded at strengthening the lower court system in each of the four residence systems to clarify and give pertinence to the Honor System as the University increases in size.

Other issues were waylaid in the late fall when, by unilateral action, students were removed from the Student-Faculty Review Board, an abrogation of part of the Student Constitution. Student leaders conferred on the mode of approach to the situation and met with the Visiting Committee of the Board of Trustees to discuss this arbitrary change in the appeals process. Before semester break, Faculty Council Chairman Spruill announced that the Council had approved S.G. requests for two committees, one to look into the history and commitment of the University Family to the practice and theory of student self-government as it has developed over 150 years. No one was arguing that, technically, the faculty and administration are the final authority, but, "Where do we stand?"

Frustrated by a year of establishing itself in the flux of an outgoing Chancellor, S.G. rallied behind a wealth of welfare projects, such as a Career Day for local and state government employment opportunities co-sponsored by the Institute of Government (director John Sanders, a former S.P. Student Body President), with Lannie Shuff as Lawler's personal aide in the project.

Visiting from Chile for the year was N.S.A. and Ford Foundation-sponsored Cecilia Gajardo, who, by the end of September, was meeting University co-eds through eating arrangements organized by S.G. for her at the sororities. As a means of creating more informed student leadership, the campus N.S.A. committee sponsored a one-day Leadership Institute for a pilot group of 25 residence hall members; the initial program was so successful that it was enlarged in the Spring for a Fraternity Leadership Institute. Involving itself in a wide range of student interests and heretofore neglected elements of the student community, S.G. housed and prepared information packets for visiting high school debators

in the early fall. Similar informational packets went to the Toronto Exchange students who visited campus before Tranksgiving. On campus, S.G. sponsored a slightly-attended "Meet Your Candidates" program for freshmen. Off campus, Lawler and Duke law professor Lawrence Wallace opposed the speaker ban law in a debate at Duke against a Durham attorney and a female Duke student.

The Committee to host the National Merit Scholarship finalists was expanded to handling several projects as the Committee on Honors; Lawler continued his efforts for student representation on pertinent faculty committees. Presidential Assistant Ellis, socially engaged at Christmas, was busily engaged investigating the possibilities of at least a partially self-supporting Yack.

Even with the student generation being a mere four years, training projects were set in motion to provide a fund of idea-oriented leadership that would be the backbone of S.G. activities and would see their fruition in following years. An administration whose mistakes were public knowledge, it left personnel aware of the issues, dedicated to student self-government and capable of carrying on the projects and ideas of the Lawler Administration.

ORIENTATION STRESSES ACADEMICS

If this year's Orientation Program could be said to have had a dominant theme, it was Academics. This subject was covered in detail by orientation counselors, assemblies, panel discussions, and, in the case of Freshmen, the attending of classes a day early. A book discussion that was supposed to involve this theme was

continued from the previous year. Orientation tried to avoid the "study or flunk" approach to academics. Instead, all new students were urged to realize the opportunities they had to develop themselves through their studies, their new friends, and their surroundings.

Orientation will not and never can be a perfect thing, but it should always try to do more than simply acquaint the new students with the physical layout of the campus. We who served as counselors and Orientation Committee members sincerely hope that we, at least partially, reached our goals.

Student Autonomy and Academic Freedom Concern Student Legislators

Will those in favor of BR-35-11, A BILL TO PLACE BEFORE THE STUDENT BODY TWO CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS, please signify by saying "aye" . . . opposed "no" . . . The bill clearly carries. Thus the organization of the Inter-Fraternity Council Court became the first major piece of legislation of the 35th Assembly.

During the summer of 1963, the North Carolina General Assembly passed a "speaker ban" directed at state institutions of higher learning. The Student Legislature was quick to realize the serious implications of this law with respect to academic freedom,

and, after much serious deliberation, passed a carefully worded resolution calling upon "the student community of North Carolina to inform itself and to join in reasoned action to effect the removal of this statute."

The Legislature became deeply concerned when the University Administration took unilateral action to abolish the Student-Faculty Judicial Review Board. This action resulted in a major confrontation between Student Government and the University Administration. The problem involved the entire theory of student self-government, and, at press time, was still unresolved.

The Legislature has been quite active in residence hall affairs, beginning with a large appropriation for the salaries of intramural managers. The Residence Hall Improvements Committee was reorganized and directed to press for significant improvements in residence hall social facilities with all possible speed.

The 36th Assembly, only three sessions old, saw a flood of legislation, including a sizeable appropriation for the remodeling of a residence hall social room which is to be a "Pilot Project." Pending legislation in early January were two resolutions concerning the civil rights demonstrations which had been plaguing Chapel Hill for several weeks.

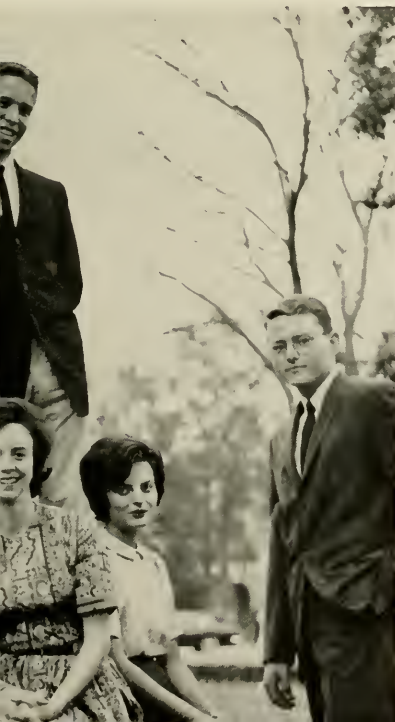

Forum Invites U.S. Leaders

After a somewhat slow and disappointing start in the fall of this academic year, the Carolina Forum initiated a fine spring program despite the competition of the Carolina Symposium in May. Its purpose is to bring outstanding citizens to Chapel Hill to speak on topics of current interest.

The Forum worked out arrangements for an address in the spring by Drew Pearson and various North Carolina gubernatorial candidates, particularly dealing with the campaign issues concerning the University. Others extended invitations were Senator Barry Goldwater and Governor George Wallace of Alabama. At press time, Senator Hubert Humphrey was trying to work out a trip to North Carolina that would bring him to the University of North Carolina in Raleigh, Duke University, and finally to Chapel Hill for the evening address.

As yet, the Speaker-Ban Law has not worked any direct hardship on the Carolina Forum, but this organization will continue to be strong in its opposition to the existence of such controls.

NSA At Home and Abroad

The National Student Association concentrated on expanding political concern and action beyond traditional Student Government circles. It organized leadership seminars to attack the urgent problem the University faces in its growing complexity: a breach of relations among students, faculty, and administration.

The committee responded to a call for help from the Government of Algiers to donate books to its University's library destroyed by sabotage and fire during the struggle for independence. It acted as an information medium between the Association and the campus. With Academic Affairs, the committee prepared a student course catalogue.

Attorney General Staff Expands

It is the duty of the Attorney General's staff to investigate and present before the appropriate council any alleged violations of the Honor or Campus Codes. The expanding University and increasing importance of the role of the judiciary has necessitated a specialization in several areas. Besides the two staffs for the Men's and Women's Councils, last year another group was organized to take care of all dormitory violations and the presentation of cases before the I.D.C. Court. The newest expansion is to include an assistant Attorney General to handle particular campus code violations to be handled by the I.F.C.

When a case is turned into the Attorney General's office, it is assigned to a member of the staff for investigation. Another member is assigned to serve as defense counselor for the accused in order to explain his rights and the procedure of the council. It is the duty of the investigator to summon all necessary witnesses, gather statements, and present his own summary of the case. The defense counselor assists in aiding the defendant himself.

In essence the Attorney General's staff represents the contact between the accused students and a particular judging body. It was originally set up so that members of the council would not have to do investigation themselves and thus have prior knowledge of a particular case.

Membership more than doubled in 1963-64. Senate members wrote a student history of the University of North Carolina and investigated race relations in Chapel Hill. Debate topics included civil rights, U. S. foreign policy, fraternity discrimination, and the infamous North Carolina speaker ban.

The Party Of Action!

The University Party, founded in 1926, is Carolina's oldest political party. It is based on the Jacksonian principle of democracy that "the more persons active in a government, the stronger the government."

Holding as its basic aims a stronger student government, the Party continued its efforts during the fall to bring student government closer to the students on the campus and to bring more students into an active participation in student government. The Party conducted a mailing about student government to entering freshmen and provided a book with information during the beginning of school.

In November, in an unexpected announcement, Mike Chanin resigned his position as Party Chairman, ending the longest term of office in party annals. Jeff Adams, former Sergeant-at-Arms of the Party, was elected Chairman for the remainder of the year.

As the Party of Action, the University Party created two committees during the fall to make reports to the Party during the next spring. The Academics Problems Committee was to investigate various academic problems brought out in the 1963 UP Platform. The second committee created, the Campus Action Board, was to seek out grievances about anything and everything on the campus and to channel these complaints to the proper committees or persons.

The Party's plans for the spring included a series of meetings with various administration leaders to discuss their relations with the students on this campus and to explain how their respective areas work. The outlook for Spring Elections was especially strong with the prospects of returning to the Executive Office and of having a majority in the Student Legislature leading the way.

The Men's and Women's Councils are the courts of original jurisdiction for violations of the Honor and Campus Codes. In this sense, their function is a regulatory one, but it is also creative as they attempt to educate the student body about the responsibilities of academic freedom and student government.

The most important activity of the year for the Councils was the Review Board controversy which saw months of discussion upon the composition and procedures of the panel which reviews all appeals from the men's and women's councils. Two major changes were instituted by action of the Faculty — alteration of the panel to an all-faculty board instead of a joint student-faculty one, and an automatic appeals process by which any conviction would be reviewed in a new hearing. Grounds for appeal need not be stated in the request.

As the result of a vigorous student protest before the trustees and the Faculty Council, negotiation by two committees was instituted and was still going on by press time.

Student Responsibility

The work of the Councils began during Orientation for Freshmen. Under a newly instituted system, an entire day was devoted to the Women's Council for the presentation of the rules which concern women students. Entering male students were given two lectures and a quiz in addition to the movie which informally presents the Honor System.

After fall elections, new Women's Council members were encouraged to work closely with the residences in their respective judicial districts for the purpose of educating students about particular problems in this area of student life. In conjunction with their male counterparts, they undertook a series of speaking engagements in men's dormitories concerning the Campus Code and the penalties given for violations of both codes.

Spring activities included meetings with faculty members and a study commission charged with investigating the problems associated with the Honor and Campus Codes as the University becomes increasingly larger.

The programs were financed entirely by contributions, amounting to \$10,000.

The Symposium did not provide all, or even many, of the answers to this pressing national issue. However, it did present to the academic community the stimulating question, "What values of a free society are being sacrificed in the struggle for world power, and how much is the struggle worth."

The AFROTC enables the cadet to prepare for the role of a responsible citizen, a well-trained Air Force officer, and possibly a pilot. The training here consists of intensive classroom and laboratory work. Principles of effective leadership and the importance of military discipline are stressed.

During their junior and senior years, the cadets are offered an advanced AFROTC program. It calls for four extra hours of classroom work and two extra hours of drill each week. Upon the completion of the academic requirement for a bachelor's degree plus four years of AFROTC training, each cadet is commissioned and assigned to active duty.

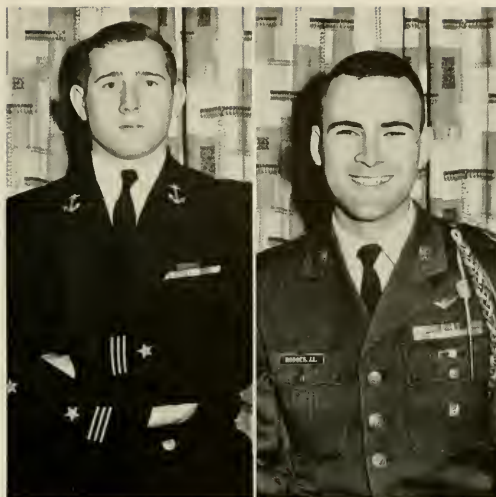


SCABBARD AND BLADE

The company serves as a medium of coordination between the two units at Carolina and endeavors to instill a modern and informed attitude toward the military services.

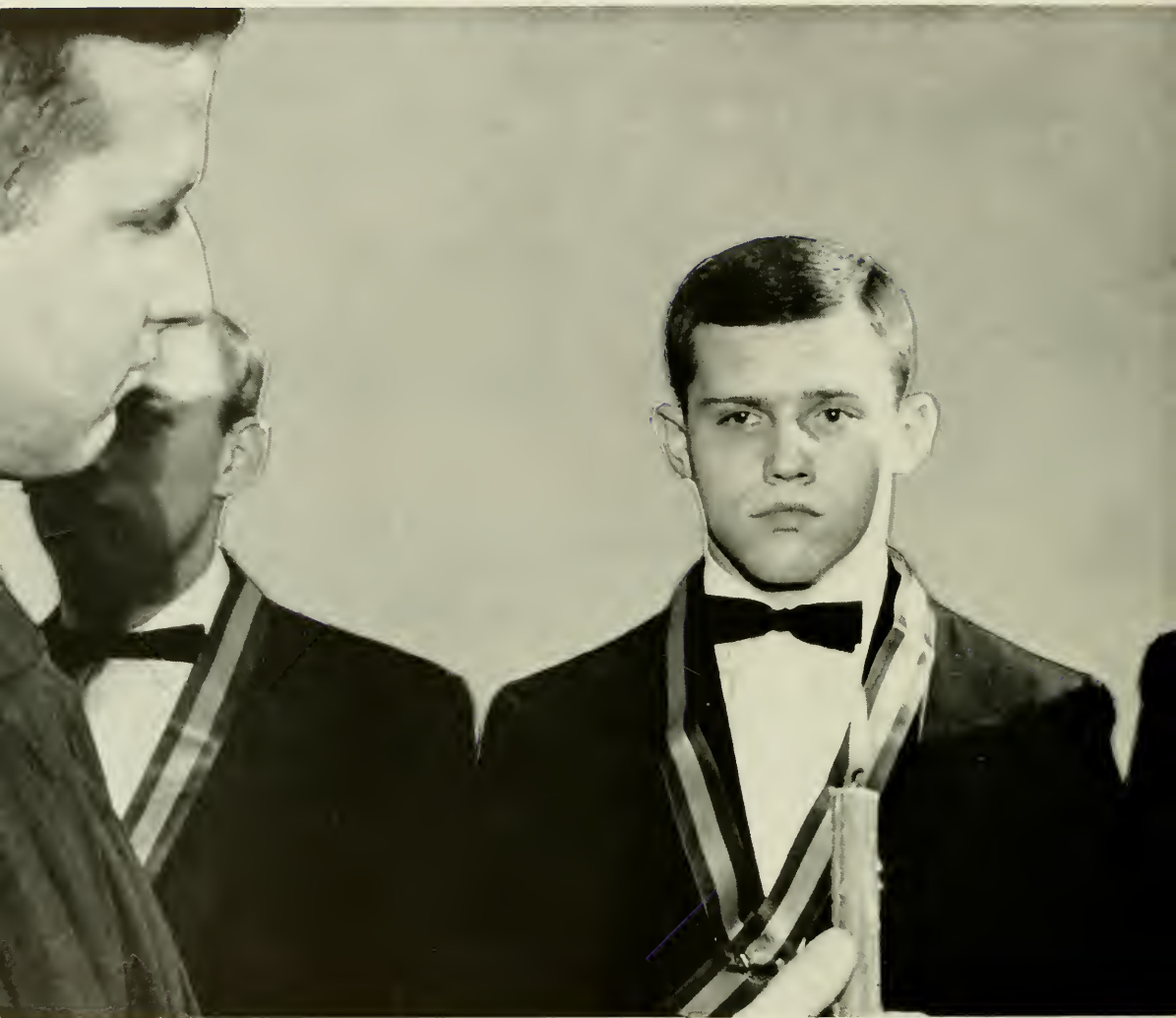

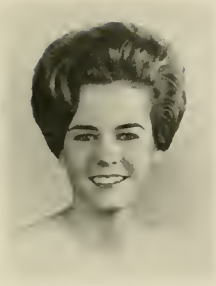
"The Great Pumpkin finally appeared!"

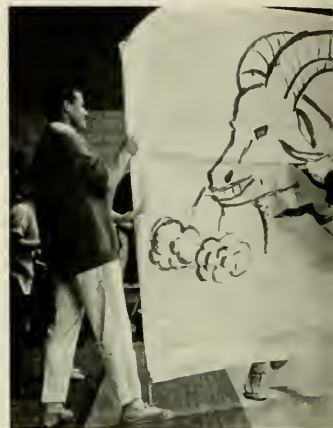
NOVEMBER 22, 1963

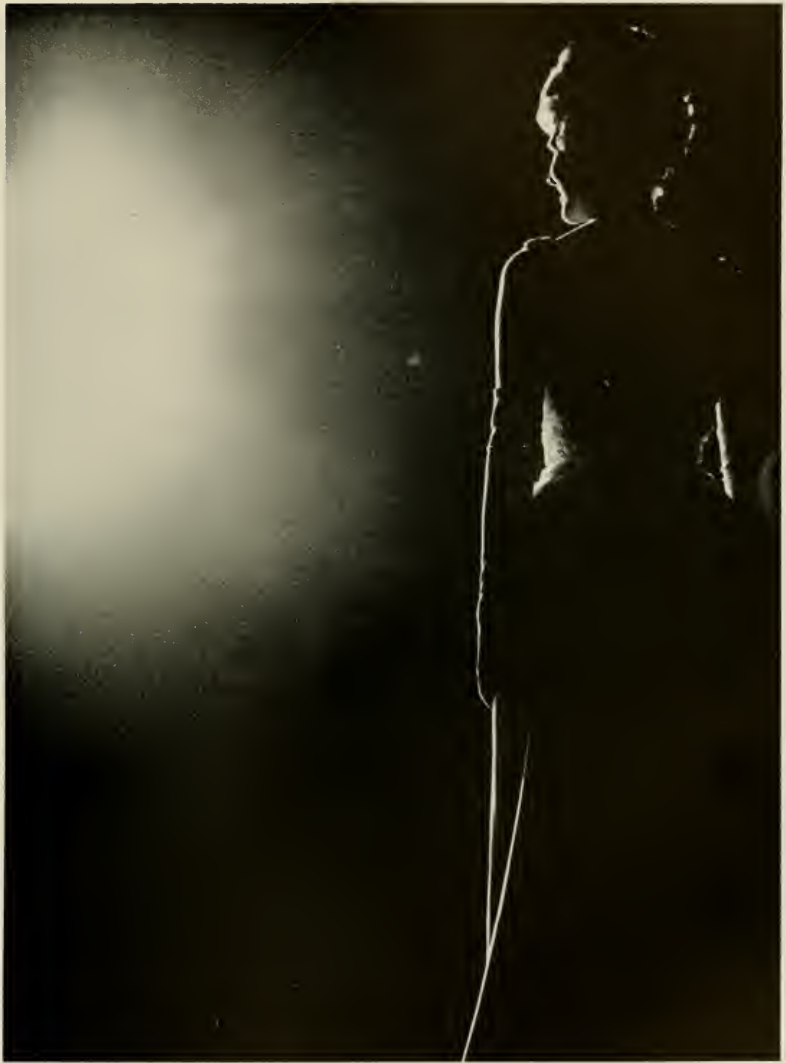


WINTER

OPENER SEES HEELS TOP VIRGINIA 11-7

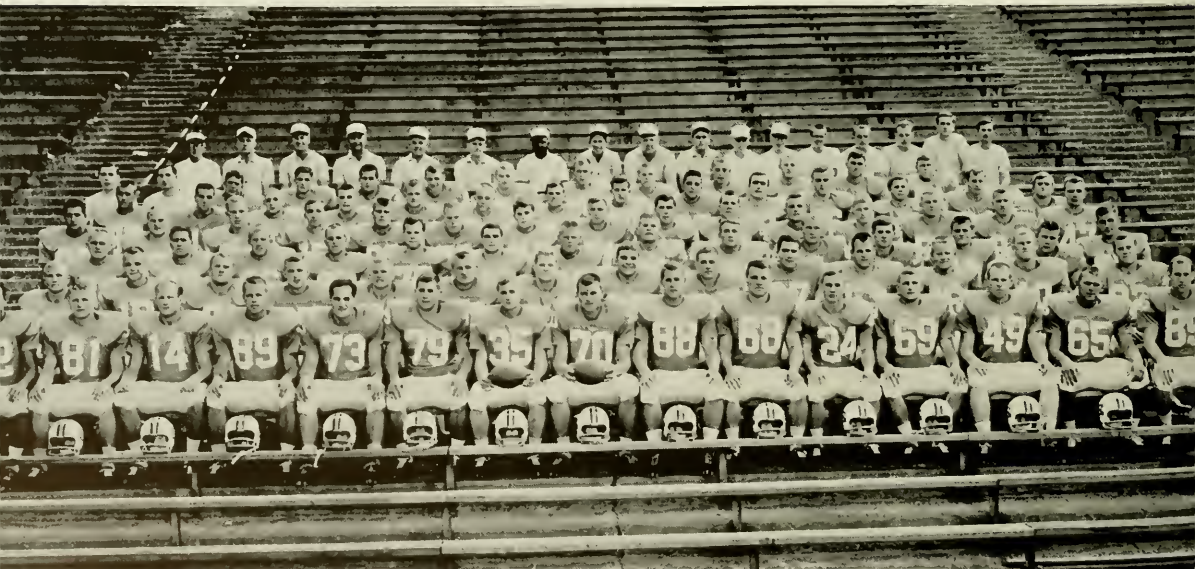

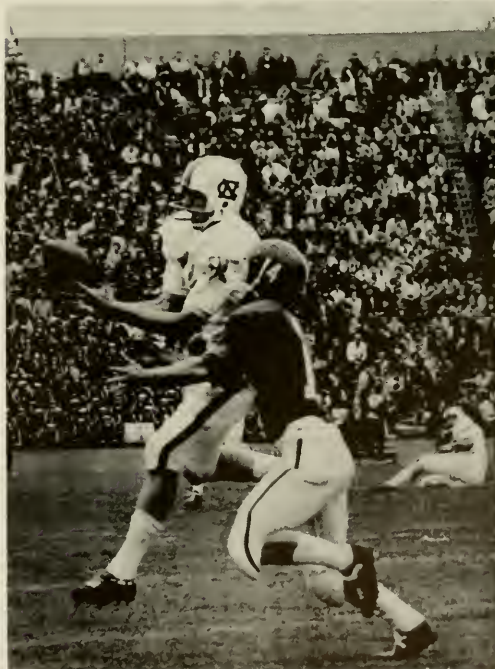
WAKE BOWS BEFORE ONSLAUGHT, 21-0

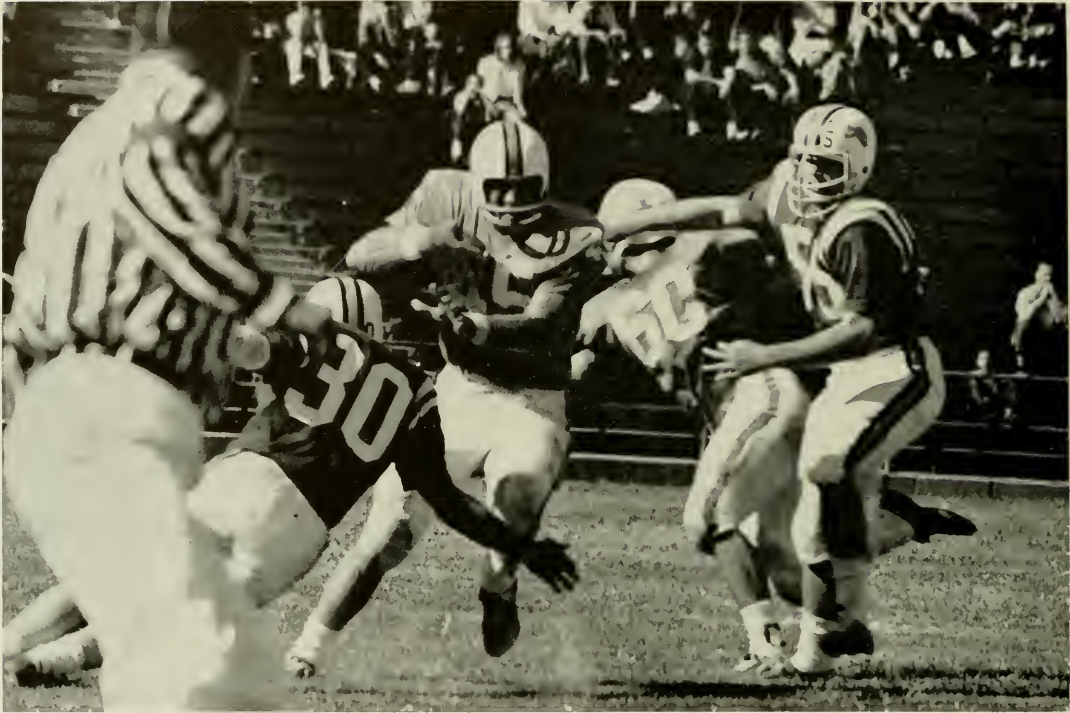

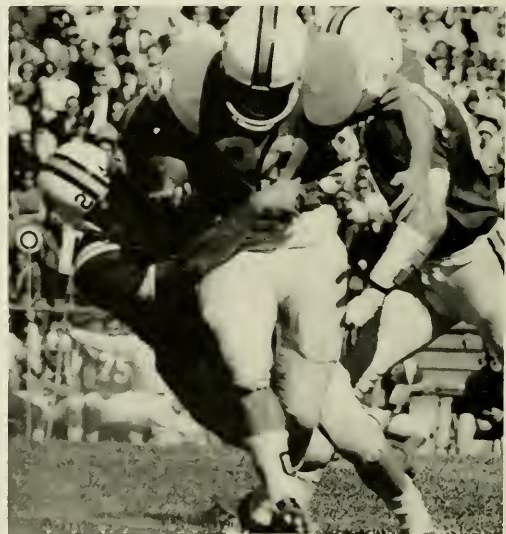

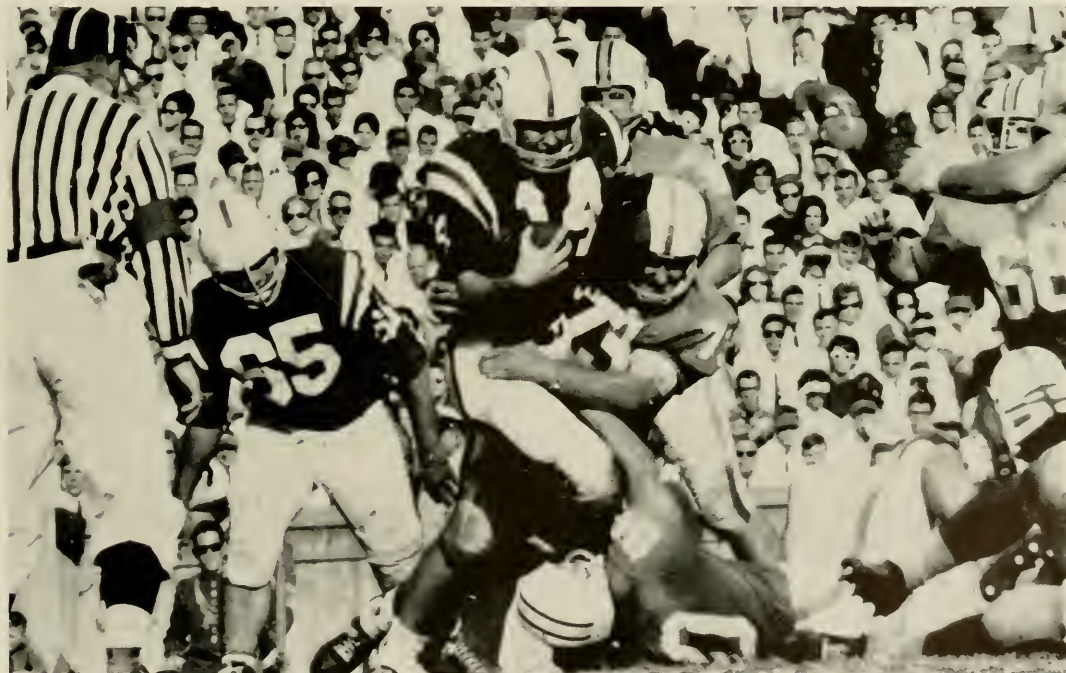


Jackson looks on as Edge-Robinson combination makes final score 31-10.

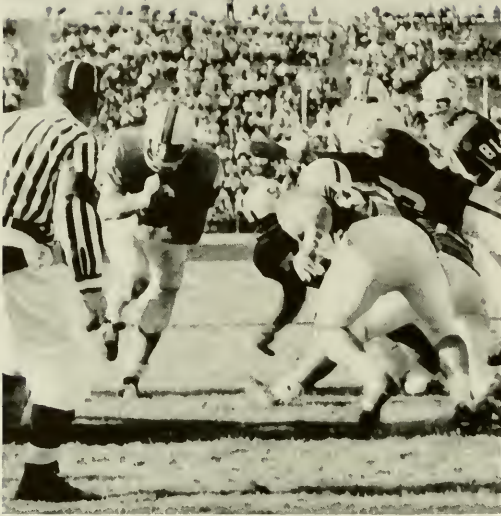

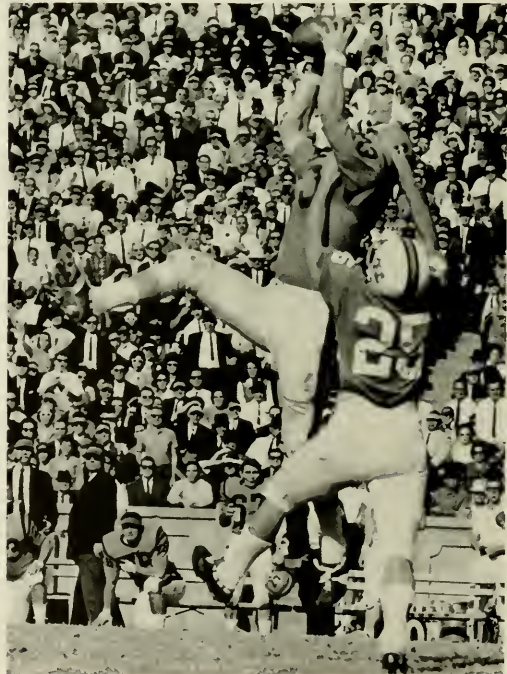
CLEMSON CLIPS CAROLINA, 11-7

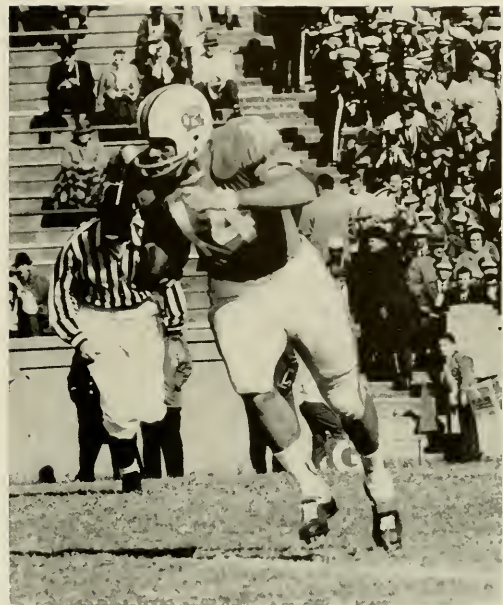


TAR HEELS EDGE GEORGIA 28 - 7

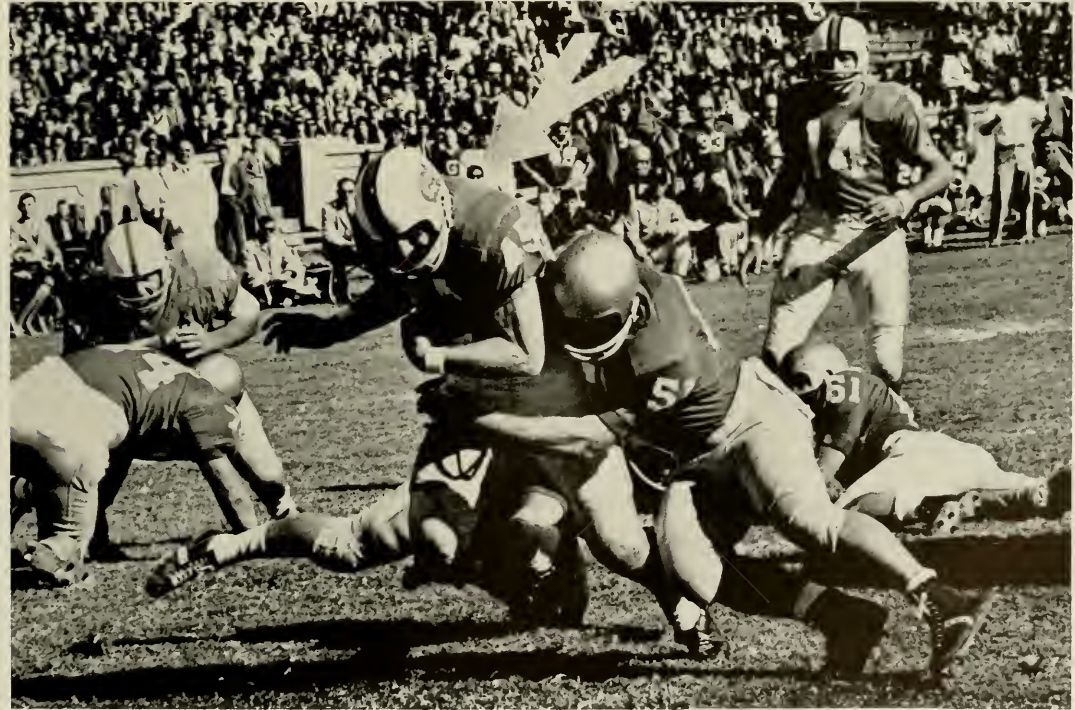

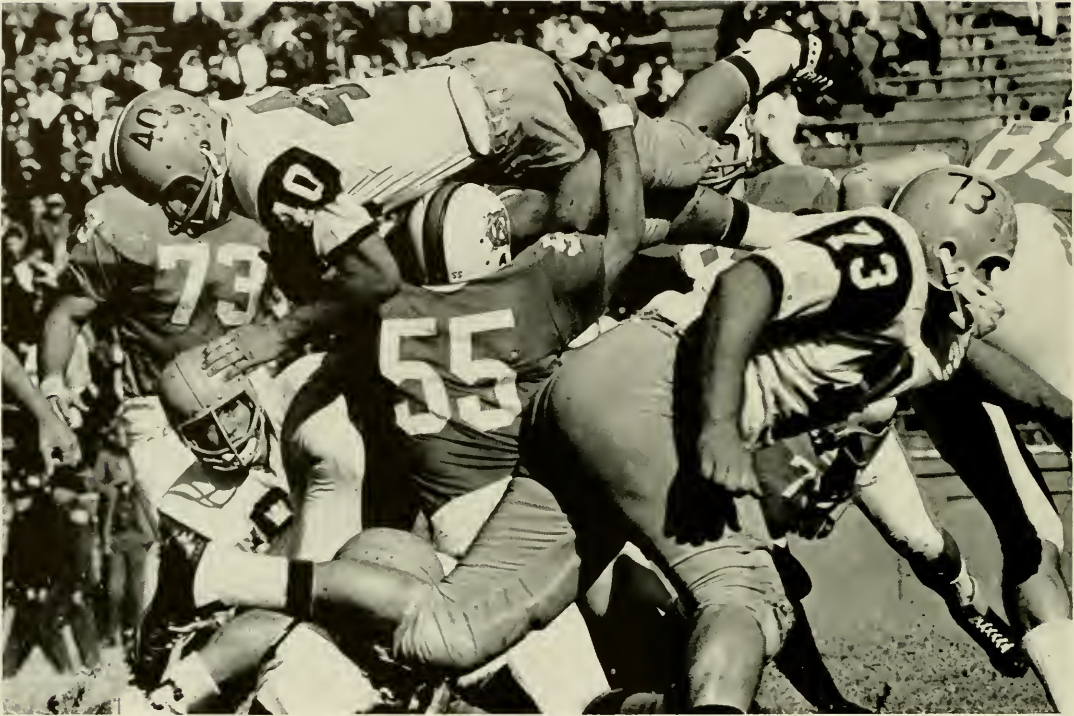

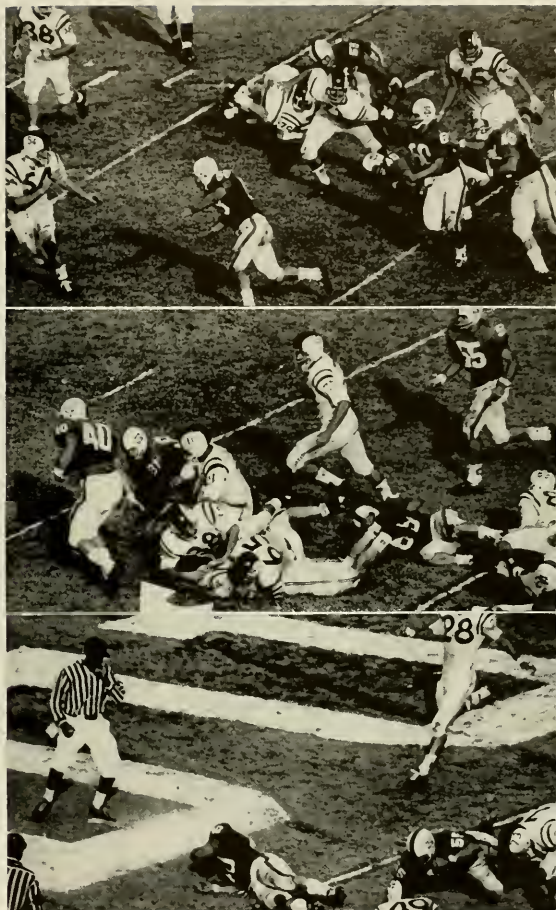

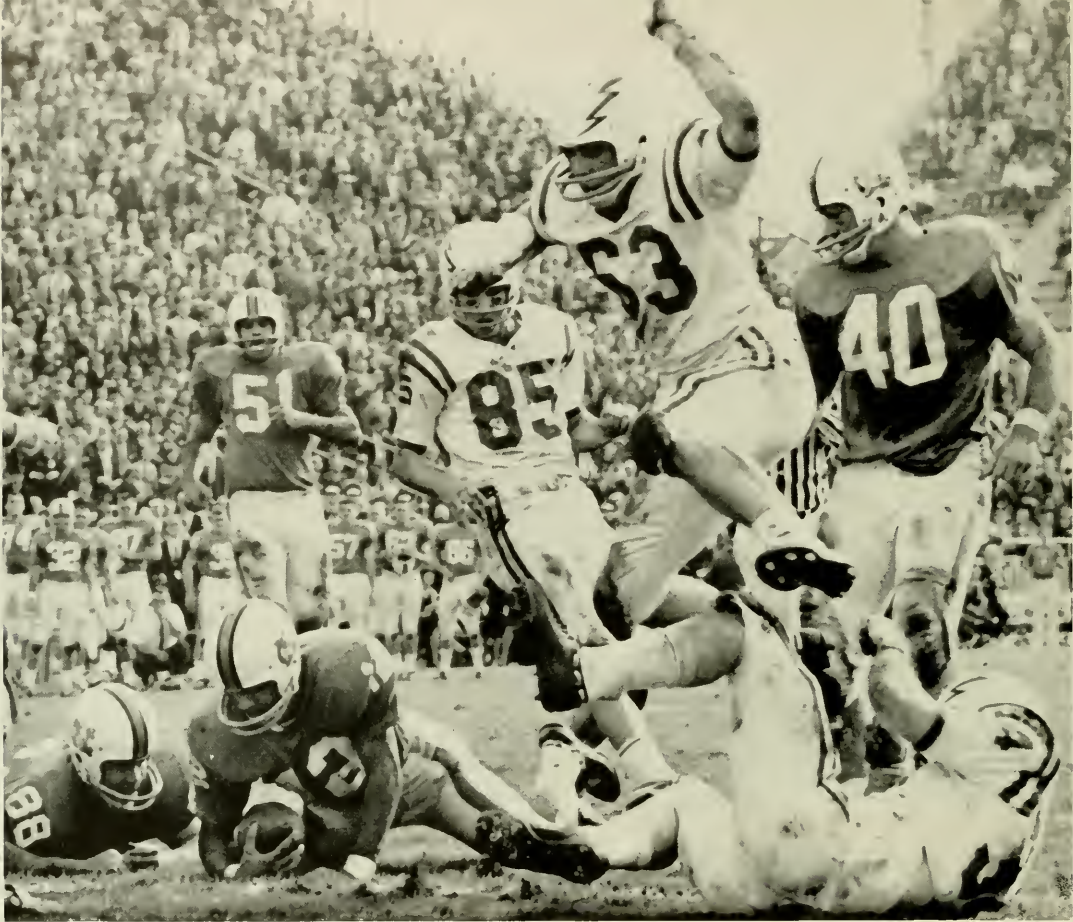

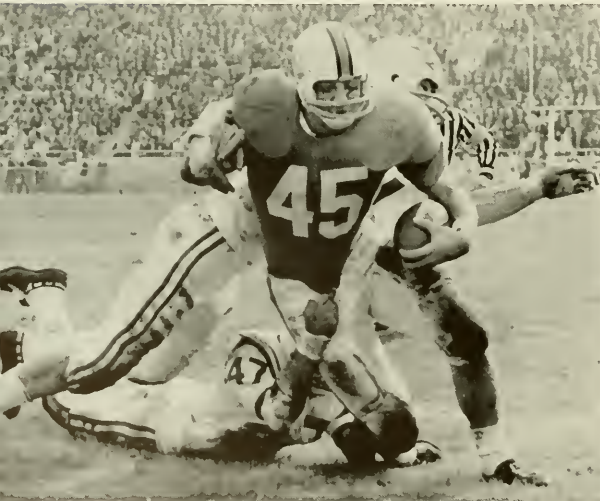

He has averaged 16.6 rebounds per game, and in the Maryland game he pulled down an amazing 28. In addition this longlegged lad managed to hit 44.1 per cent of his shots from the floor to average 26.8 points per game; he also hit 64.1% of his foul shots.

Billy Cunningham, however, is not the only prize possession of Carolina. Her co-captain, Mike Cooke, combines speed and clear thinking to lead the Tar Heels against all opponents. Mike has made 223 points this year so far and has pulled down 64 re-

bounds. The other half of the captaincy, Carolina's amazing man, Charlie Shaffer, has braced his knee and made 241 points and hauled in 108 rebounds. Nothing at all has seemed to stop Charlie on his amazing driving layups.

Along with these is forward Ray Respass, second highest scorer with 254 points and second highest rebounder with 123. Ray has handled the ball extremely well and has set up many of the scoring plays. Up from last year's freshman team is forward Bob Bennett; he has managed 77 points and almost as many rebounds in his first year of varsity ball. Experience should make him a superb player. With forwards Bryan McSweeney and Billy Gallantai and guards Ray Hassell, Bill Brown, and Johnny Yokely is seen the remainder of strong bolstering support.

This shuffle team under coach Dean Smith has taken games from many fine teams this year and lost to others, but still they have proved their merit from the Madison Square Garden to the LSU indoor stadium.

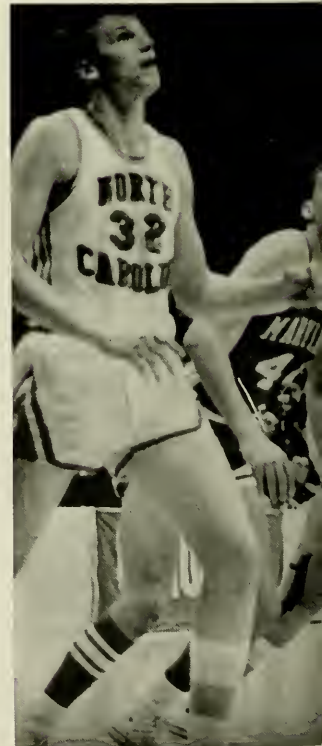

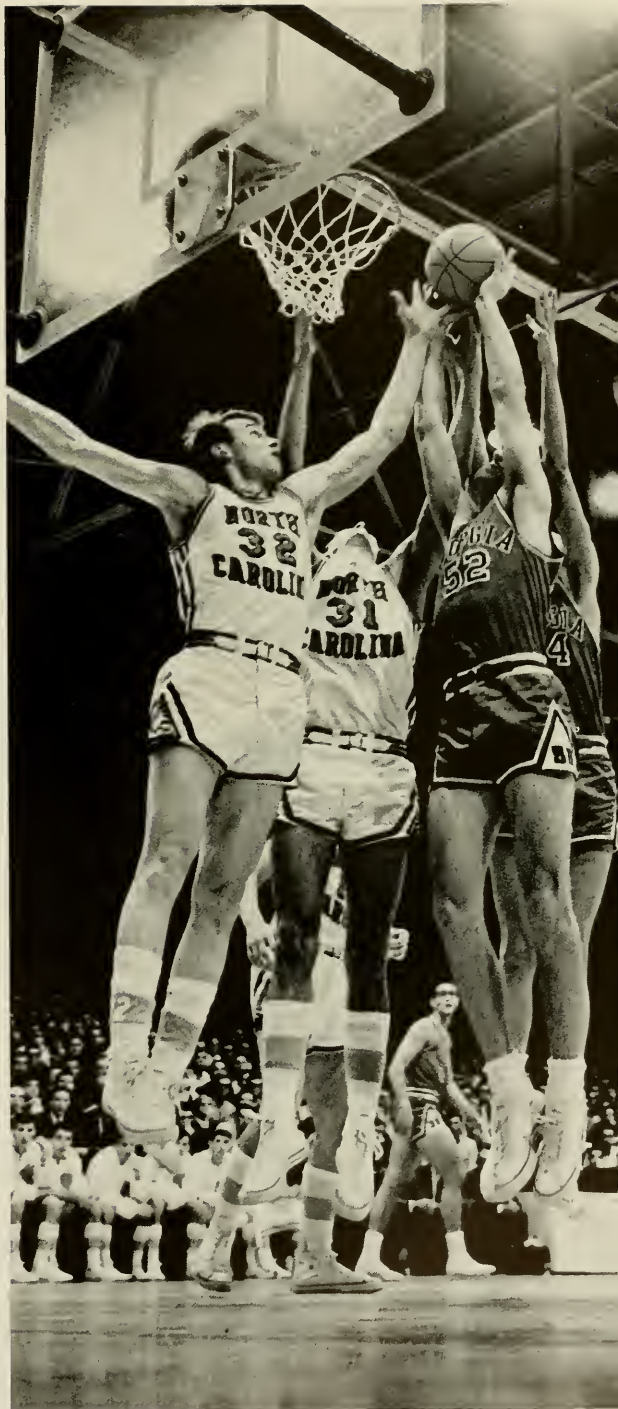

Steve Lister, 177-pounder, is one of Barnes' prize wrestlers, but an injured leg bothered him during the season.

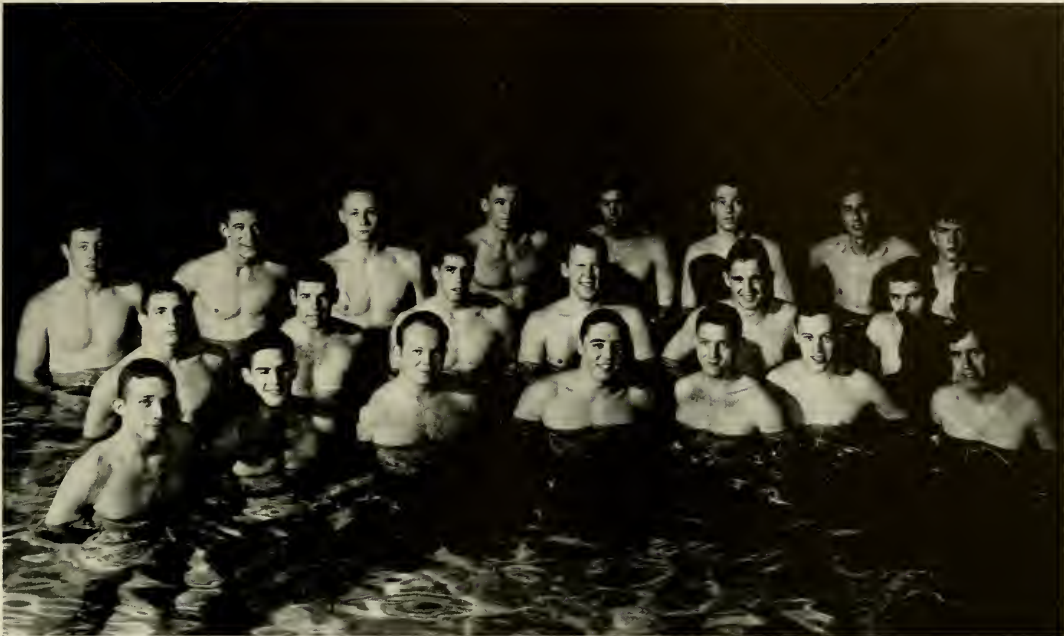

SWIMMERS DOWN ALL

Coach Pat Earey's Blue Dolphins splashed their way through an undefeated Atlantic Coast Conference schedule and appeared to be the strong favorites in the ACC Swimming Championships.

Overall the UNC squad was 12-2, 7-0 in conference action, losing only to Florida State and Florida on back-to-back nights during exam break.

All-American Thompson Mann and Harrison Merrill, plus a host of bright new stars, gave North Carolina one of its strongest swimming teams in the school's history. Records fell at an activity pace during the season, as the UNC Watermen shattered six old marks.

North Carolina opened its season against VMI, winning easily 72-23. Next they journeyed north and gained impressive victories over Navy and Princeton, 48-47 and 54-41, respectively. The Dolphins ran their record to 8-0 victories over Duke (63-31), Clemson (69-24), South Carolina (65-28), VPI (56-38), and East Carolina (59-36), before falling at the fins of the University of Florida, 48-47. On the following night, the weary UNC swimmers were dealt their second and last defeat of the regular season, as Florida State University was the victor, 60-35. Carolina ended the season with wins over Wake Forest (64-29), North Carolina State (59-36), Maryland (48-47), and Virginia (62-33).

Record-breakers were Fred Lipp in the 200-yard butterfly, Chip Smith in the 50-yard freestyle, Mann in the 200-yard individual medley, Merrill in the 100-yard freestyle, and Rick Forum in the 200-yard breaststroke. The team of Smith, Mann, Merrill, and Davis Roberts established a new mark in the 400-yard freestyle relay, while the combined efforts of Mann, Merrill, Forum, and Lipp shattered the old school record in the 400-yard medley relay.

OUTLOOK: PROMISING

"The outlook is encouraging," agrees Coach Rabb in discussing the coming season. "We expect several good prospects up from Coach Lovinggood's freshman club, especially in the pitching department. I think our defense will be improved and our hitting more consistent."

Reasons for the optimism are many. The infield of Bill Brown at first, Dick Prindle at second, Jim Speight at shortstop, and Tom Wright at third returns intact. Wright led the club with a .337 mark while Speight was second with .333.

Ken Willard, who led the club in RBI's with 18, returns to left field and Gary Black to center.

The entire catching corps is back. Ken Boykin, who also played the garden in addition to fielding, Merle Kruer, and Bernire Isgett are familiar with Rabb's pitching staff. With the personnel at hand hopes are high.

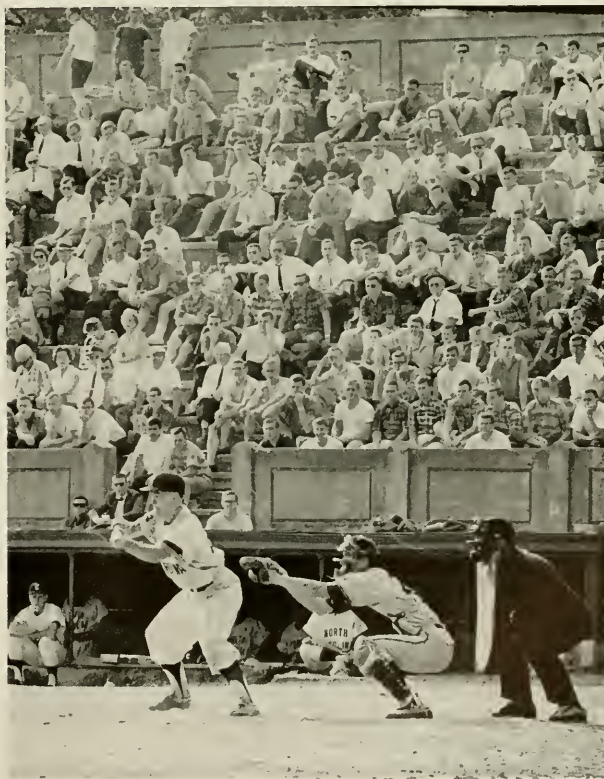


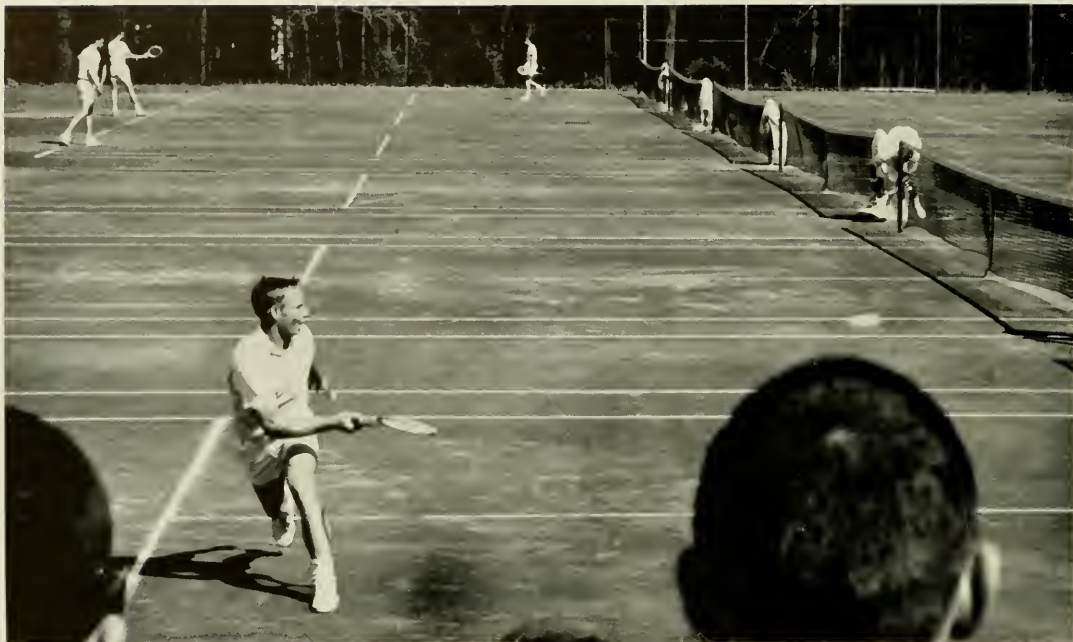

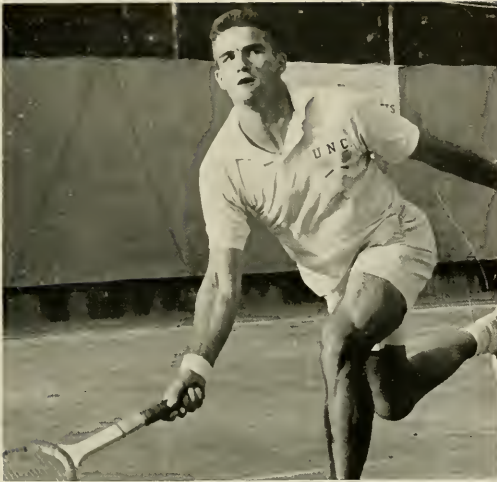


UNC'S TOP TEAM

The league championship was held at Hot Springs, Virginia. Arnold started strong for Carolina, but the overall competition found Kenney and Company finishing fifth.

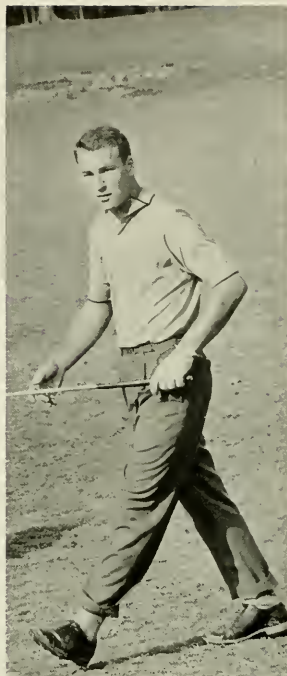
"We should be an improved team this season," predicts Kenney. "Experience, if nothing else, insures as much." The Tar Heels didn't lose a member of the top line.

SCHOOL OF NURSING



DEAN ELIZABETH L. KEMBLE

In 1951, the University of North Carolina School of Nursing first opened its doors to 26 students entering the new four-year collegiate nursing program. The school continues to pursue a four-fold approach to nursing education, offering undergraduate education, graduate education, continuation education (through extension courses, institutes, and workshops), and research in the field of nursing.

Dr. Elizabeth L. Kemble has been dean of the school since its beginning. Currently there are 40 faculty members; total student enrollment has almost reached the 300 mark. Student nurses receive training in medical-surgical nursing, maternal-child health, long-term illnesses, out-patient departments, public health, and psychiatric nursing. They also take a variety of courses on the university campus.

In 1962, **Sigma Theta Tau**, a National Honorary Society for nursing which is established only in collegiate schools fully accredited by the National League for Nursing at all program levels, initiated its charter members of the UNC chapter.

THE ORDER OF THE OLD LAMPSHADES

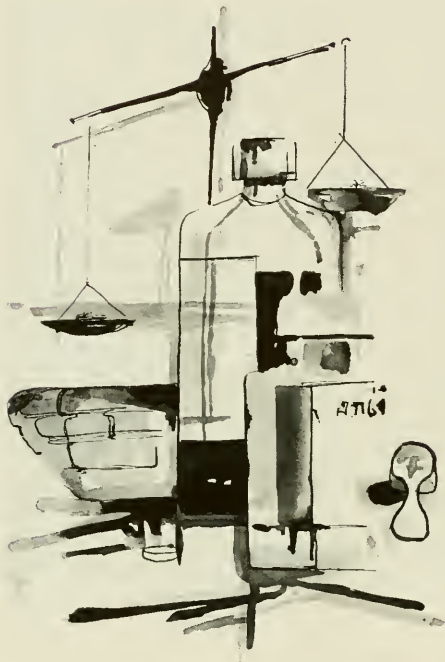

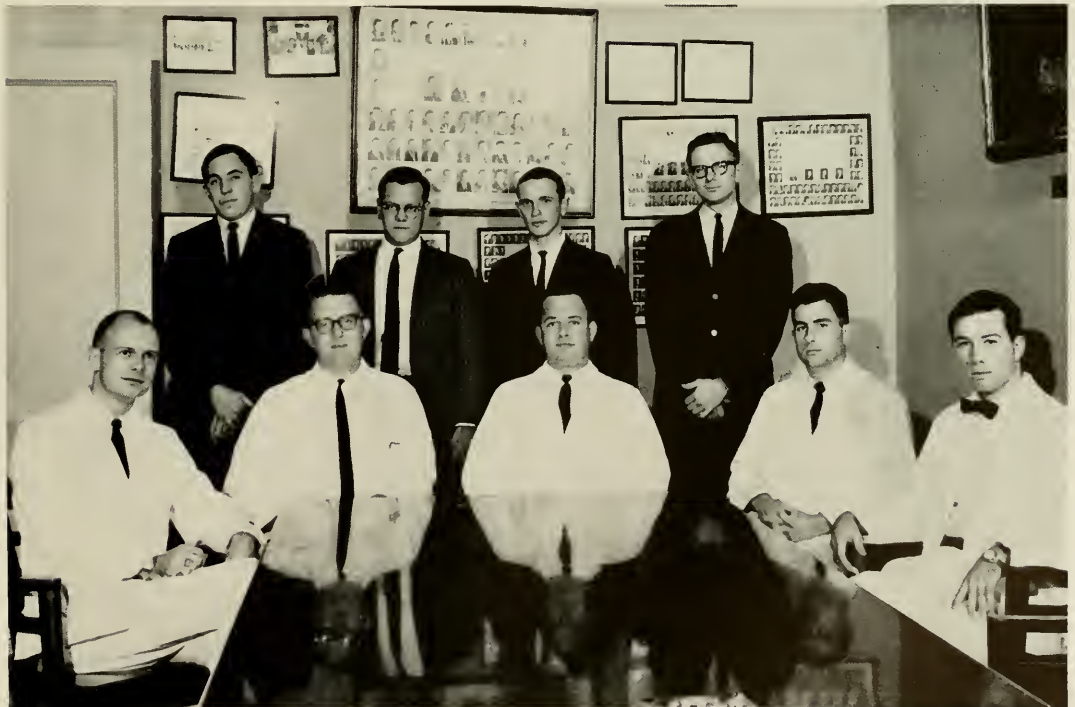

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

The year 1964 is one of particular significance to the School of Dentistry. The ground breaking ceremony for the Dental Research Center took place in March, and completion of the building is scheduled for the fall of 1965.

The Dental Research Center will be of modern design and will mark the first departure in the UNC Health Affairs area from the well-known modified Georgian architecture.

Dr. James Bawden, an Assistant Dean in the UNC School of Dentistry, also is the Coordinator of the Dental Research Center. Approximately one-third of the funds for the million dollar structure

was raised principally from dentists, the faculty of the dental school, dental manufacturers, dental supply firms, and dental laboratories in North Carolina. The remainder came from Federal and University sources.

One of the primary missions of a university and its associated schools is to extend the frontiers of knowledge. Accordingly, in addition to the several educational programs, dental research now will assume its intended place in scope and interest in the school and the University.

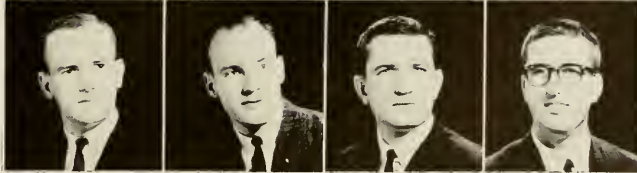

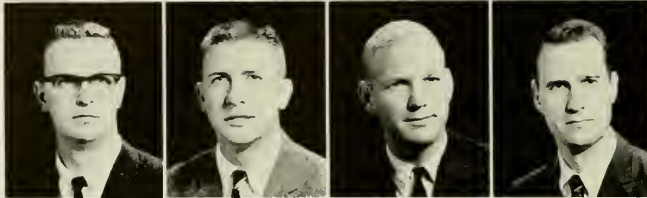

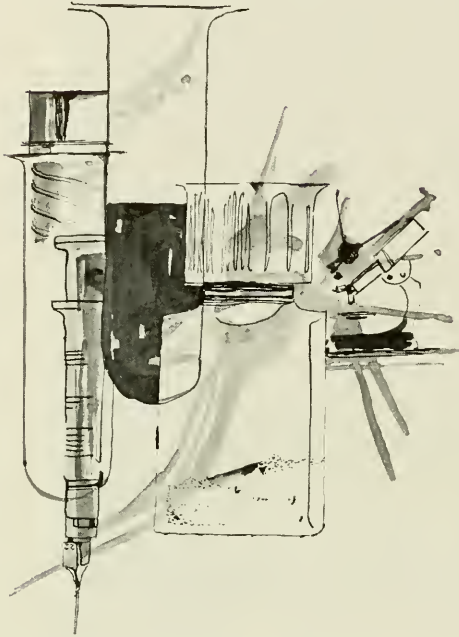

Alumni from our school are engaged in community health activities on every continent, and students come to us from around the world. At home and abroad, the problems of prevention and control of disease and pestilence, sanitation of the environment, improvement of health standards and status, and public education in healthful living have steadily gained recognition as basic responsibilities of the community on state, national and international levels.

Our School of Public Health, one of fourteen such accredited schools in North America, prepares professional workers for service

wherever their specialties take them, through study and research in the ten operating departments of the School: Biostatistics, Environmental Sciences and Engineering, Epidemiology, Maternal Child Health, Parasitology, Public Health Administration, Public Health Education, Public Health Nursing, Public Health Nutrition and Mental Health. All instruction is on the graduate level with more than one-tenth of the two hundred students engaged in doctoral studies. Basic preparation of Public Health students is in such varied fields as medicine, dentistry, education, engineering, nursing, statistics, and social sciences.

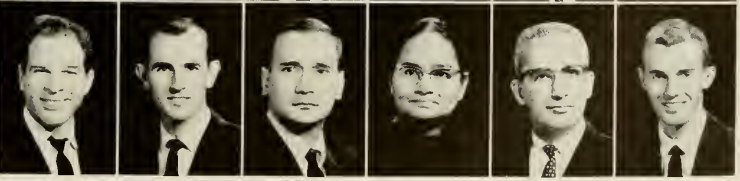

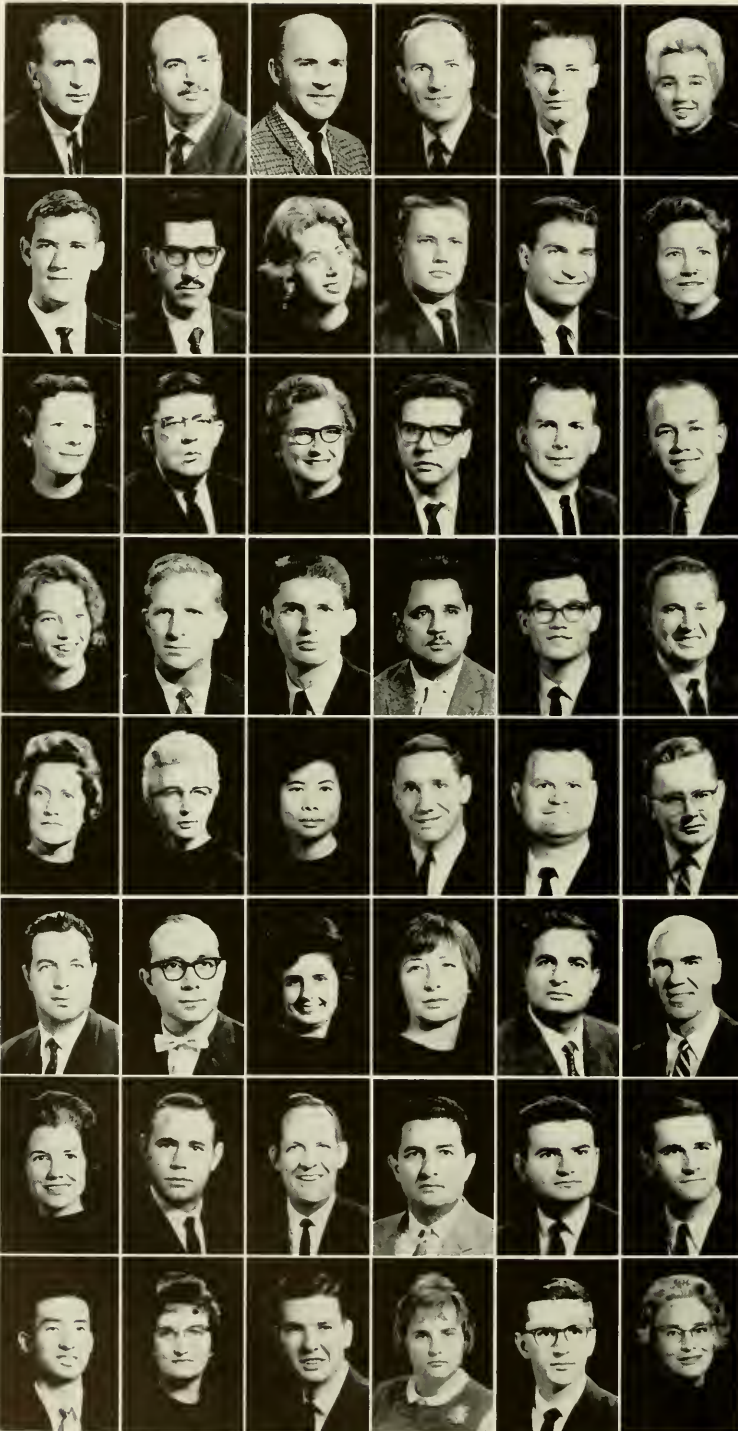

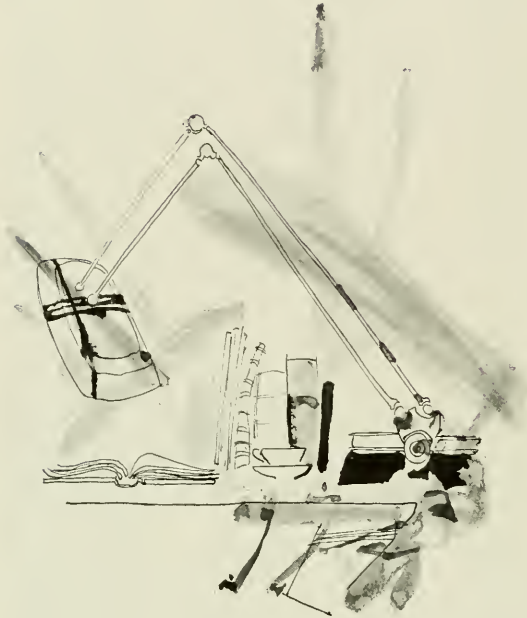

SCHOOL OF LAW



DEAN H. P. BRANDIS

The Law School, which developed into the School of Law of the University, was founded as a private school in 1843, by William H. Battle, then a judge of the Superior Court, later a justice of the State Supreme Court. In 1845, Judge Battle was made Professor of Law in the University, and the University provided that the degree of Bachelor of Laws should be conferred on those completing the prescribed two-year course. From the records of the University, however, it seems that few degrees were conferred.

For a long time the School maintained a certain independence from the University. The Professor of Law received no salary, and the students were not entirely subject to the discipline of the University. This was the position of the School during the professorship of Judge Battle, who retired in 1879; during the two years that the law classes were conducted by Kemp P. Battle, then Presi-

dent of the University; and, to a considerable extent, during the professorship of John Manning, who was elected in 1881 and died in 1899.

In 1899, the School was completely incorporated into the University; James C. MacRae, previously a justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina, was the first Dean. He was succeeded in 1910 by Dean Lucius P. McGehee, who served in that position until 1923.

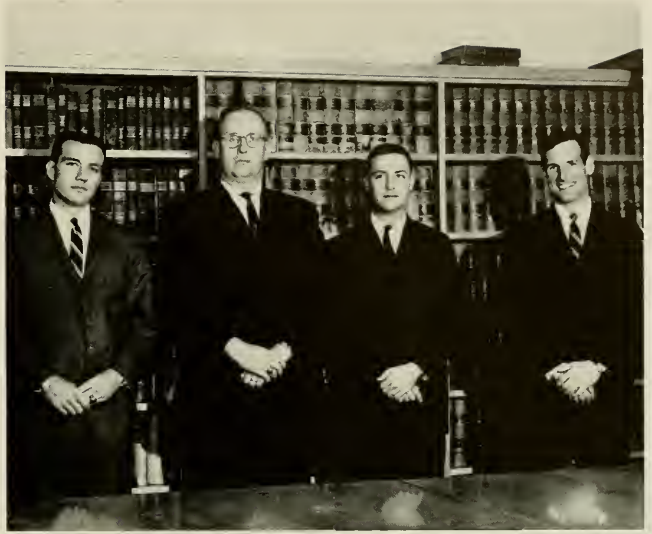
With the construction of Manning Hall, in 1923, the law school entered its "modern" era. Serving successively as deans were, Merton Leroy Ferguson, 1924-26; Abner Leon Green, 1926-27; Charles T. McCormick, 1927-31; Maurice T. Van Hecke, 1931-41; Robert H. Wettach, 1941-49; and Henry P. Brandis, 1949 to date.

All and all another successful year for the "Joyner Jocks" of UNC's best "House."



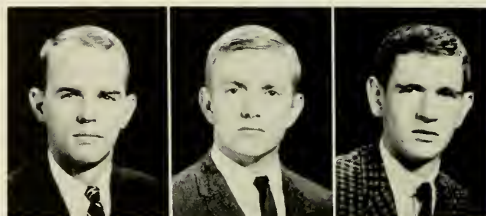

During the first administration of George Washington, on October 12, 1793, the cornerstone of Old East (originally known as "North Wing") was laid. It was the first building to be erected on the campus of any state university in the United States.

In 1846, Old East was enlarged toward the north one-half its former length. It was in this addition that the original cornerstone was covered up by bricks. The North Carolina Room of the Library has the original copper plaque that was attached to this cornerstone. The plaque was found by an alumnus in a Tennessee junk pile, after it had been missing for many years.

During the Civil War, Yankee soldiers were quartered in historic Old East. In 1924, the interior was thoroughly renovated, and at the present time Old East houses ninety-four Carolina Gentlemen.
