## From Dawn to Duok

Class rings were delivèred the first week in October; Libby Carlton was elected Homecoming Queen by the football players; the students were entertained by the faculty at a Christmas party; a semiformal Leap Year dance was given: These were some of the highlights of the year.

As the sun sank lower in the evening sky, many special events claimed the time and attention of the Seniors: the Junior-Senior Banquet, the Washington trip, Senior play, class night, and finally, on May 28, graduation exercises for the thirty-nine members of the Class of 1956.
