



Class History

We, the Seniors of '54, are at the top of the long ladder toward that great event, our graduation. Naw realizing aur school days are numbered we recall with fond memaries all those things, both large and small, which have made our high school life so enjoyable. As we shall soan be the Alumni af Gibsonville High, we wish to share some of our memories af the days which seemed so many but were far too few.

In September, 1950, sixty-five excited and happy Freshmen entered high school. Under the guidance of Mr. Gerald D. James, aur principal Mr. I. H. Vickery, Jr., and Mr. Glen Macy, our homeroom teachers, we quickly adjusted to the schedule. Class officers chasen in Mr. Macy's room were Robert Tickle, Glenn Smith, and Irma Walker and in Mr. Vickery's room were Peggy Gerringer, Nancy Greeson, and Mary Edna Apple. Many of us took part in club activities and several of our classmates began their athletic careers, which will not soon be forgotten. The year seemed to pass slowly, but at last it was over. We were glad to have a summer vacation.

September, 1951, found farty-seven sophomores in the homerooms af Miss Doris Nance and Mr. Frank Randall. During the first days af school we chase as aur class officers Glenn Smith, president; Robert Tickle, vice-president; Nancy Walker, secretary; and Raland Shepherd, treasurer. Members of our class joined in more activities and really became an outstanding part af aur high school. We struggled through **Julius Caesar** determined ta pass and most of us did, tao. May finally rolled around, and we faund that half of our high school days were over. We eagerly looked farward to September and aur Juniar year.

In September, 1952, forty-three noisy Juniors entered Miss Catherine Chifelle's homeroom and found that we had a new principal, Mr. Martin C. Freeman. Class officers were Rabert Tickle, president; Howard Ray, vice-president; Mary Edna Apple, secretary; and Susan Randolph, treasurer. During this exciting year one event fallowed another closely. Our Junior Play, "Lights Out," which we shall all long remember, was presented an December 5 and 6. Our ruby class rings, which we had waited far sa long, arrived on March 30, 1953. Finally, on April 24, our last taken to the Seniors, the Junior-Seniar Banquet, "Starlight," was given at the Mayfair Cafeteria in Greensboro. The days flew quickly, and before we realized it, one of the best years of aur lives was gone.

September 10, 1953, found us farty-two gay and carefree Seniors. At last we were at the top. We were leaders in many activities, being led ourselves by Miss Estelle Brawn. Chasen to lead our class were Raland Shepherd, president; Susan Randolph, vice-president; Ann Ingle, secretary; and Billie Ann Younger, treasurer. The annual Staff was soon elected and began to work hard on ane of the highlights of our Senior Year, the publication of the "Yell-O-Jak." Carolina blue and white were chosen as our class colors, the red rose as our class flower, and "Strive Forward to Seek the Best," as our motto. On Navember 11, Judy Schoolfield and Frankie Allred were chosen as our class mascats. We began to look forward to our Senior Play, the Juniar-Senior Banquet, the Washington trip April 20-25, and finally our graduation on May 31.

Now that we shall soan be the Alumni, we realize as we take our apposite paths in life, that we shall miss the many good times we have had together, but we face the future with high hope and courage, believing that we shall be able to overcome all trials which are in our paths because we have built a firm foundation while at Gibsonville High. Now as we ga out into the warld we hope we shall be able to do justice ta our fine school and that someday you will be able to oint to us, the graduate of '54, and say, "I knew them when"
