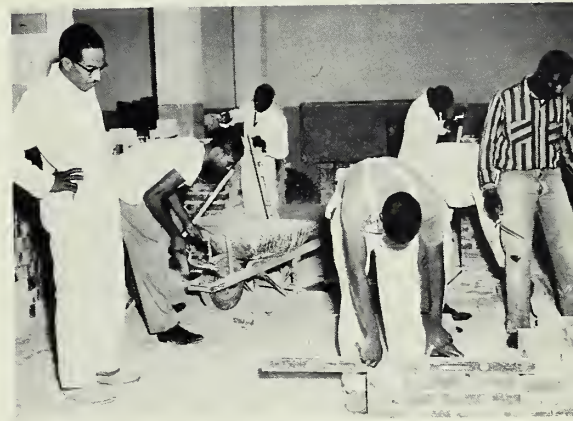

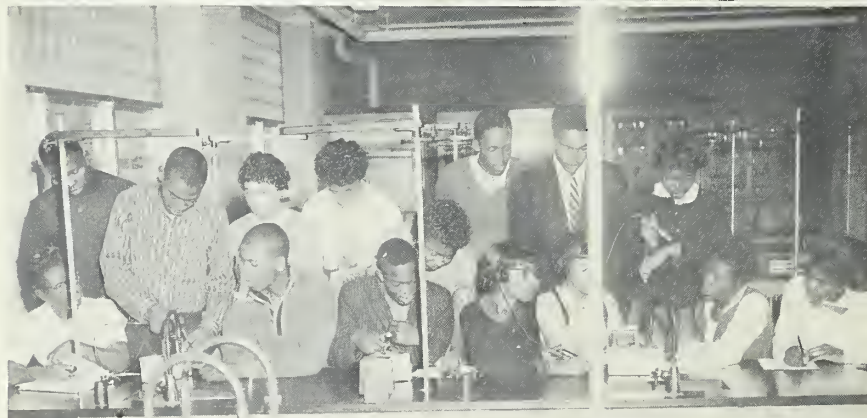

In all who have been associated with them, The Athletic Committee has instilled a sense of loyalty to Carver. Their contributions will long be remembered by the Carver family.



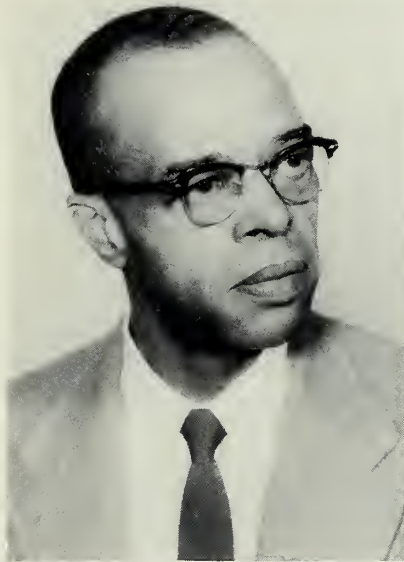
ADMINISTRATION
