Dan Best is up to his neck in politics; he thinks he may become President.

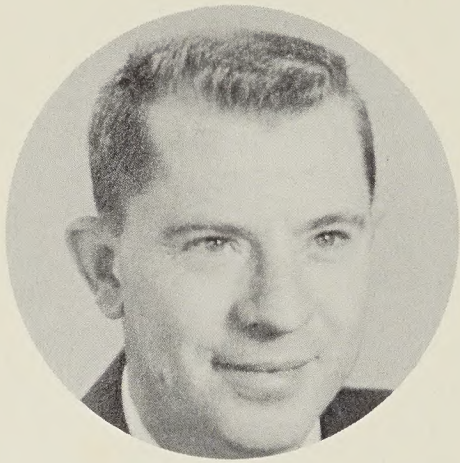
I see Jo Cutshaw is entertaining guests with her mad guitar at her summer resort.
