Yes, we at Carver High School have lost a scholar, friend, advisor and a great administrator.

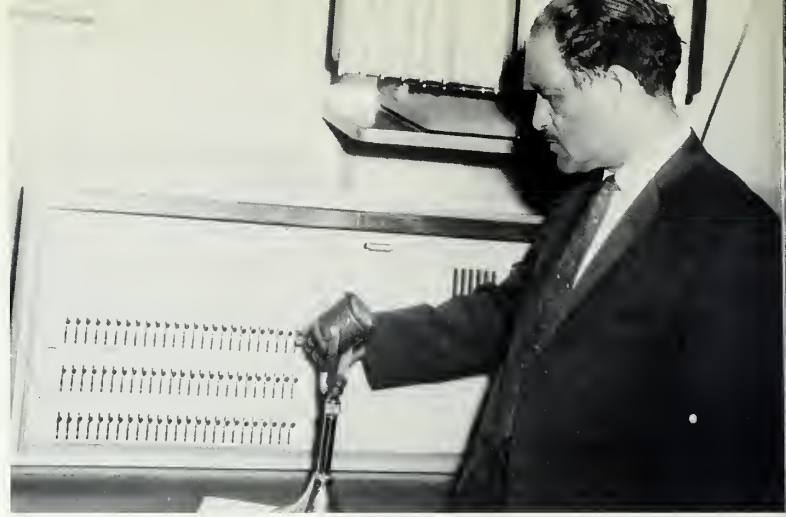
